



### Western-Central Command Row for Charity

In November last year, the Western-Central Command wanted to create an annual charity event that challenged both the individual and the team, physically and mentally, whilst raising awareness for AFP Legacy. Whilst they acknowledge it is impossible to replicate the tough times that family and friends experience when they lose a loved one, they wanted to show their support by toughing it out in a 24hr row challenge.

In the days leading up to the event the team were made aware that the WC SHIELD team had created a roster of participants to come along and row with them to break up the monotony of the hours, in total they had 33 participants join them during the 24-hour challenge. These participants were drawn from teams all over WC AFP such as PSO's at DPU, Federal Agents from CT, Crime Teams, and Intelligence, WAPOL secondees, HR and support Teams and the Executive branch.

As all members participating in the Moe Row challenge were from the Protection Operations Response Team (PORT) they already knew each other's strengths and weaknesses and worked together to complete the challenge. Whilst there were times during the event where everyone experienced mental and physical fatigue, they drew on the support of others and the reason for the event to motivate them.

A combined total of 482,896 metres was rowed between the SHIELD support crew (190,293) and the Moe Rowers (292,602), an impressive feat!!

Following the row challenge, AFP Legacy organised a breakfast which allowed the team to spread the mission of AFP Legacy in a formalised manner.

As can be seen by the title "Moe & Row" the team also grew some impressive moustaches to raise awareness of Men's Health during the month of November (Movember).

### Quest for Life Retreat: AFP Legacy Legatee Review





As a busy mum of four, I was extremely grateful to be given the opportunity from AFP Legacy to spend a week at the Petrea King Quest For Life Centre located in the peaceful Southern Highlands Village of Bundanoon. I enrolled in the Moving Beyond Trauma program. This program is for people with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder or Complex Post Traumatic Stress Disorder. The environment at Quest For Life is nurturing and conducive to aid in the healing process. Each day started with voluntary participation sessions of gentle yoga stretching and meditation. I took part in all of the voluntary sessions to enable myself to get the full experience and hopefully some baby steps towards healing. After a delicious hot/cold breakfast each morning the first session follows. I will mention that after every session there is a tasty snack or hot/cold meal waiting for you. It resonates with one of my mantras "feed the problem" ......probably explains my comfort kilos I am currently escorting around. As a busy single parent, to have all my meals cooked for the five days, that alone was a treat in itself.

The Facilitators claim, that this is not a 'fix everything in a week program', however, they do claim that they have provided some tools to add to your tool kit for recovery and healing.

After the sudden death of my first husband and my second marriage dissolving due to unpleasant circumstances, I

am consciously aware to be strong, have mettle and keep going with the healing process. At times, I have fallen off this road and have spiralled down, however, thankfully not to the point that required medical intervention. Recovering and healing is hard but I owe it to my beautiful daughters to have grit, persevere and keep gathering tools and utilising these tools to hopefully overcome what life threw at me. I don't want to pass on my trauma to my children especially as they have their own trauma to overcome.

I am also hoping that eventually these tools help me to become myself again, as I miss the old Rachael.

From the bottom of my heart, thank you AFP Legacy for suggesting this beautiful and peaceful place and for covering the costs, as I honestly know that I wouldn't have been able to attend without your help.

For anyone reading this who feels they may need help with recovery, please be brave and talk with AFP Legacy. I am guilty of telling AFP Legacy that "I am fine, the girls are fine" when really it's quite the opposite. I am too proud, but also feel that I am not deserving enough, as surely there are people with worse circumstances, who are more deserving of help......but our kids need us and we need to be strong for them. Asking for help is hard, but if you can just pick up the phone or send a text or email and say, hey I need some help ......AFP Legacy will move the world for you and stop at nothing to help.




### **Melbourne Airport Tatts to AFP Legacy**

### Soldier On Veterans Support the Community



In 2019, Colin and two other Veterans, Mike Hogan and Rod McIntyre, decided on a guitar project. The aim of the project was to reach out to the local community in Canberra, asking them to donate guitars and ukuleles to Soldier On members who would then repair them if necessary and they would then be given to Veterans, disadvantaged children and community music groups.

The group have so far donated almost 200 guitars and ukuleles to Veterans and other organisations such as the Police Boys Club, AFP Legacy, an Indigenous Club who teach music to young children, a homeless shelter and many schools around the area. Members of the music group, Navy Veterans Colin Greef and Mike Hogan, have spent many hours on the road visiting schools around New South Wales donating guitars to students who show an interest in music, but due to financial constraints, do not have a guitar of their own.

The Soldier On Veterans have donated a number of guitars and ukuleles to the AFP including 10 to the local Police Youth Club at Erindale and eight to children of AFP officers.

The donation of instruments to these children is a small way of giving something back to the community, but also brings a lot of joy to the children who have an interest in music. The group have also visited schools on the South Coast after the fires and in the west of NSW where drought has caused huge problems within the farming community. After a short concert from Colin and Mike the guitars are then presented to the children who have been nominated by the school Principal. Colin and Mike

also donate a few guitars to the school for everyone to

### AFP Legacy Board Secretary Ms Kim Crimmins PSM





Kim Crimmins, AFP Legacy Secretary

In the 2022 Australia Day Awards, AFP Legacy Board Secretary, Kim Crimmins, was awarded the Public Service Medal (PSM) in recognition of outstanding service, particularly in the area of victim liaison in both a domestic and international setting.

Kim was integral in the creation and development of the ACT Victim Liaison Officer (VLO) program, assisting victims of crime through the investigation and court processes, and enhancing how police respond to their legislative requirements under the Victims of Crime Act 1994.

In July 2014, Kim was identified to assist the AFP Family Investigative Liaison Officer (FILO) response to the 41 deceased victims' families resulting from the downing of MH17 in the Ukraine (Operation AREW). Following her first deployment to Ukraine, and because of her exceptional efforts, Kim was requested to remain a full-time member of the FILO team.

Since this time, Kim has deployed, led, or engaged with AFP FILOs in response to various critical incidents, providing guidance to hundreds of victims through exceptional and deeply traumatic circumstances, to ultimately lessen the impact of the offences committed against them. In doing so she not only had a positive impact on their lives individually but ensures the positive reputation of the AFP, both in Australia and internationally.

For her service, Ms Crimmins has been awarded the AFP Operations Medal, four AFP Commissioner's Group Citations for Conspicuous Conduct, the AFP Service Medal and the AFP 40th Anniversary Citation. In 2021, she was also announced as the Most Outstanding Female Practitioner as part of the Australian Council for Women and Policing 22nd Excellence in Policing Awards.

AFP Legacy would like to congratulate Kim on the awarding of her PSM and for her continued outstanding service.
