A bequest ensures your generosity continues to bring lasting benefits to individuals and families, beyond your lifetime. Even the smallest gift can make a huge difference for those in need.

There are three main types of bequests that you can make to AFP Legacy in your Will:

1 Pecuniary

A specific dollar amount, a life insurance policy or a percentage of an estate.

2 Property

Real estate, shares, bonds or other particular items of value.

3 Residue

The remainder of an estate after you have provided specific items and amounts.

AFP Legacy is a registered charity and relies entirely upon the generosity of giving, to deliver its compassion and wellbeing services. Any size of bequest of any type is most gratefully accepted by AFP Legacy.

Frequently Asked Questions

1. How do bequests help AFP Legacy?

All financial contributions, no matter how big or small are gratefully received by AFP Legacy. We are a registered charity and rely entirely on giving to deliver our compassion and wellbeing services.

Our assistance supports Legatees impacted through incapacity, major illness or the loss of life through:

- Financial support for the costs of living, household maintenance and education.
- Personal support through counselling and therapy in the recovery from trauma and grief.
- Social support through camping and hiking trips, lunches and Christmas celebrations and other special social occasions.

2. How do I include AFP Legacy in my Will for a bequest?

As your Will is a legal document, we advise that you obtain independent legal advice from a Solicitor. They will provide the appropriate wording.

Before drafting your Will, you need to consider what you would like to provide to AFP Legacy. As stated on the left, the following are most commonly bequeathed in Wills:

- "Pecuniary": A specific dollar amount, a life insurance policy or a percentage of an estate.
- "Property": Real estate, shares, bonds or other particular items of value.
- "Residue": The remainder of an estate after you have provided specific items and amounts.

3. Can I direct how my bequest is to be used by AFP Legacy?

Yes, you certainly can.

Most often, how a bequest is to be used is left open to the discretion of the organisation, the terms of the current constitution, and in delivering on the organisation's mission and priorities.

For some bequests, the bequest is made for a specific purpose e.g. the establishment of a tertiary scholarship. If you wish to provide a bequest for a particular purpose, you should be explicit in your Will and to your executor(s) and your request will be respected and honoured.

4. Can I direct what is publicised about my bequest to AFP Legacy?

Yes, you certainly can.

Most often, how a bequest is to be published is left open to the discretion of the organisation. In practice, this typically means we will publish our gratitude to you for the nature of your gift, i.e. financial, property, the establishment of a scholarship etc.

If it is your wish that AFP Legacy do not publish any or only limited identifying details about your bequest and its nature, you should be explicit in your Will and to your executor(s) and your request will be respected and honoured.

5. What is AFP Legacy's Legal Name for the purposes of a bequest?

In any document which you or your Solicitor drafts relating to a bequest to AFP Legacy, the following legal name and address of our organisation is required:
